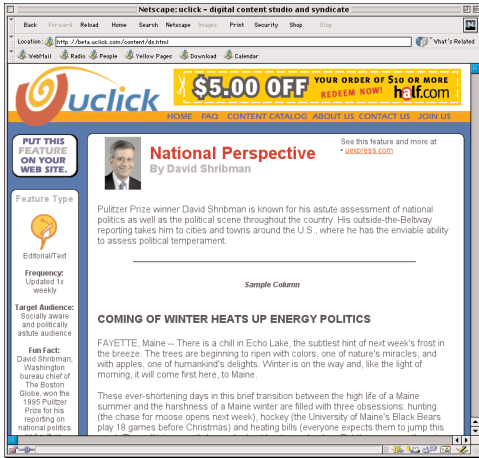

Shribman is executive editor of the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette, a position he has held since December 2002 after serving as assistant managing editor, columnist and Washington bureau chief during his 10 years at The Boston Globe. His column, NATIONAL PERSPECTIVE is syndicated by Universal Press. He also writes a column for the Post-Gazette called "My Point."



Shribman was awarded the Pulitzer Prize in journalism in 1995 for his coverage of Washington and the American political scene. He joined the Globe after serving as national political correspondent for The Wall Street Journal. Prior to that, he covered Congress and national politics for The New York Times and was a member of the national staff of The Washington Star. He began his career at The Buffalo Evening News, where he worked on the city staff before being assigned to the paper's Washington bureau.

A native of Salem, Mass., Shribman is a summa cum laude graduate of Dartmouth College, where he was elected a member of the Phi Beta Kappa honor society. He did graduate work at Cambridge University, England, as a James Reynolds Scholar.

He is a member of the Board of Trustees of Dartmouth College, a member of the Board of Visitors of the Nelson A. Rockefeller Center for the Social Sciences at Dartmouth and a member of the Board of the Hillel Society of American University in Washington. He is also a member of the editorial board of "Dilemmas in American Politics," a series of scholarly monographs published by Westview Press, Boulder, Colo.

Shribman delivered The Boston Evening Globe as a youngster growing up in the Boston area. At Dartmouth, he was the recipient of the Globe's annual Arthur Segal Scholarship.

He is married to Cindy Skrzycki, a Washington Post financial columnist, and they live in Washington, D.C. with their two daughters, Elizabeth and Natalie.
